# Introduction

When submitting equipment homologation applications to Bolivian regulatory authorities, manufacturers and their representatives frequently encounter compliance issues that delay approval processes. Based on our extensive experience in the field, we have identified four critical errors that occur in approximately 90% of submissions.



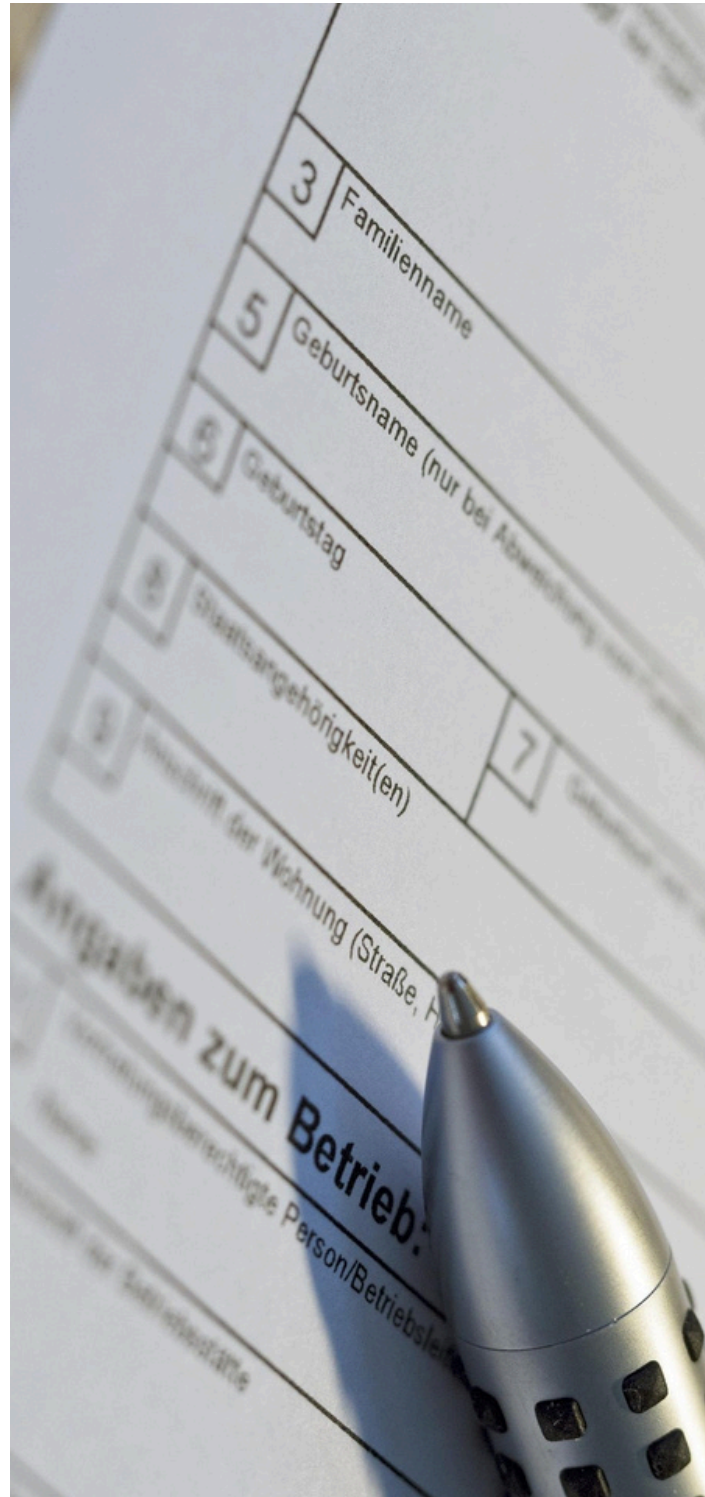
# 1. Weight and Dimensions Documentation

Current Bolivian regulations have eliminated the requirement for weight and dimension specifications. Submitting this information is no longer necessary and may contribute to documentation redundancy.



## 2. Form F1 Submission

Form F1, previously mandatory for all applications, has been removed from current regulatory requirements. Manufacturers and representatives should not include this form in their submissions, as it is no longer part of the standardized process.



# 3. Excessive Documentation

The Bolivian regulatory authority maintains a streamlined documentation requirement consisting exclusively of:

- Technical manual
- User manual in Spanish
- FCC certificate or Declaration of Conformity (DoC)
- Corresponding test reports

Submission of additional documentation beyond these specified requirements is unnecessary and may complicate the review process.



# 4. Absence of Spanish User Manual for Automotive Equipment

For devices designed for automotive installation, a final user manual in Spanish is not required. In these cases, applicants must submit a formal letter stating that the device is integrated into a vehicle and therefore does not include a standalone Spanish user manual. This exception is permitted under the understanding that the vehicle's comprehensive user manual will provide adequate instruction for operating all integrated electronic devices.
